- The Fund will invest at all times at least 75% of its net asset value in fixed income securities of countries that are represented within the FTSE World Government Bond Index (USD Hedged) (the "Benchmark").
- All debt securities purchased by the Fund will be either rated Investment Grade or
 if unrated deemed by the Investment Manager to be of comparable quality at the
 time of purchase.
- The Fund may also invest up to 25% of its net asset value in debt securities of emerging market countries as defined by the JP Morgan GBI-EM Global Diversified Index.
- The types of debt securities the Fund may invest in include debt securities issued or guaranteed by national governments (including inflation-protected securities) and debt securities of supranational organisations.
- Alongside traditional financial and economic analyses, the Investment Manager integrates an evaluation of the potential impacts of material ESG factors on an issuer, to determine whether, in the Investment Manager's view, an issuer's ESG practices present a financial opportunity or risk for an investment. This ESG integration will include qualitative research and may also include data driven risk analysis.
- The Fund promotes environmental characteristics and is classified as an Article 8 financial product pursuant to the Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation ((EU) 2019/2088). The investments underlying the Fund do not take into account the EU criteria for environmentally sustainable economic activities, however, in line with its ESG methodology, the Fund may hold investments that seek to contribute to climate change mitigation and climate change adaptation.
- The Investment Manager follows a value approach to investing and seeks to identify relative value in the global bond market. The Investment Manager defines as undervalued those markets where real interest rates are high and the currency is undervalued and stable or appreciating. The Investment Manager will concentrate investments in those undervalued markets where cyclical business conditions as well as secular economic and political trends provide the best opportunity for declining interest rates and a return to lower real rates over time.
- The Fund will normally hold a portfolio of debt securities of issuers located in a minimum of 6 countries, and the average weighted duration of the Fund's portfolio generally ranges between +/- 4 years of the effective duration of the portfolio of securities comprising the Benchmark.
- The Fund is actively managed, and the Investment Manager has discretion in selecting investments within the Fund's objective and investment policies. The Investment Manager seeks to: (i) provide an average annualised return for the Fund, on a gross basis over rolling 5-year periods, equal to the annualised return of the Benchmark plus 1.5% (gross of fees) (the "Targeted Return"); and (ii) achieve an average weighted duration for the Fund's portfolio of between +/- 4 years of the effective duration of the portfolio of securities comprising the Benchmark. There is no guarantee that the Investment Manager will meet its targets (i.e. (i) and (ii) above), and the Targeted Return does not take into account the fees charged, which will reduce the Fund's return.
- The Fund may also invest in certain types of derivatives for efficient portfolio management purposes and/or investment purposes. The Fund ,may be leveraged as a result of investment in derivatives. However, the Fund will not be leveraged in excess of 100% of its net asset value.

shall be at least two Dealing Days per month.

Directors: means directors of the Company for the time being and any duly constituted committee

thereof.
